KEY FEATURES

The construction of both the Madison Elementary and Middle School took place simultaneously. Dunlop & Johnston, Inc. completed the general trades package which consisted of excavation and site work with new utilities, paving, concrete, masonry, structural and miscellaneous steel, aluminum windows and doors, interiors, painting, floor covering, wood floors, casework and other accessories. Each school project included a complete site development package with new water service, storm and sanitary utilities, parking and lawn areas. The middle school site was significantly larger and also included four full soccer practice fields.

The school is constructed of a typical masonry bearing walls with precast concrete slab for the second floor. The building's exterior is masonry veneer and metal siding. The roof framing is steel or masonry bearing joist and deck and also features a distinctive open glass clerestory entry area and an open second floor hallway.

Each school has similar classroom and administration wings. The Middle School includes 40 classrooms, each equipped with the latest technology. It also has a larger gym, stage and student dining area than the elementary school building. Dunlop & Johnston, Inc. coordinated the work with the construction manager for a successful finish in time for the 2013 school year.
