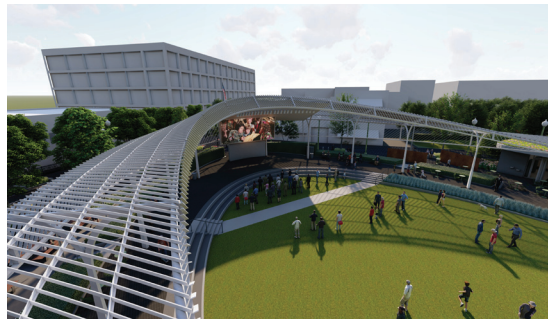

## KEY FEATURES

Our team was hired as the General Contractor to build the City of Canton's Centennial Plaza in conjunction with the Pro Football Hall of Fame in honor of the NFL's centennial.

The vision was to transform the grassy block downtown formerly known as Market Square. Centennial Plaza, a 2-acres park, is intended to draw people to downtown Canton for concerts and activities affiliated with both the City and the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

The project consists of a rotunda that welcomes you from Market Ave. N. It has four 65' tall stainless-steel spires that come together to give an impression of a football and can serve as a performance area. The spires were inspired by the rotunda of the Hall of Fame building, designed to resemble the seams of a football. The pavilion, which is reminiscent of a football stadium, includes a covered stage backed by a 60-foot video board, and a wall and sound system that can be used for concerts and movies.

Other features include a café building with a circular opening in its roof that'll project light into the sky, outdoor seating area with fire pits, a "Canton" script sculpture, choreographed lighting, movable furniture, gas fireplaces, a play garden, social garden, and a fog feature. What may attract the most attention are 11 steel-and-glass pylons, between 6 and 8 feet high, with the names of every NFL player who ever played one down. Visitors will be able to use cell phones to access digital information about the players listed. There are more than 25,000 NFL player names listed.
